**The Old Dump**  
**New Boston Road**

- The New Boston Rd site, "the old dump", has been closed for use by the Town and the State of NH.
- Per the State of NH, NO ONE is permitted on the site until the final inspection by DES and the final closure has been approved.
- If any waste was unearthed or if the cap is disturbed in any way, the cost of removal for everything in the ground will fall on all taxpayers in the Town. The waste is considered **HAZARDOUS**. This does not cover the cost of returning the site back to its natural state of recovery.
- A town in NH had their capped landfill compromised, and it cost the taxpayers roughly \$2.5 million dollars to dispose of the **HAZARDOUS** waste. The site work after hauling the waste was an additional cost to the taxpayers.

### Background:

Roughly around the 1920-30's, Candia residents' have disposed of its trash at the 119 New Boston Road parcel, Map 406 lot 101, consisting of eight and sixty-seventh acres, which borders the North Branch River, and there's a registered, unlined municipal ash landfill on site that has been covered. In 1976 the Incinerator was erected at the site and the town began burning their trash for disposal. An additional accessory building was erected for use as storage and a swap shop in the late 1980's near the entrance of the site. The ash landfill ceased operating prior to July 1981 with clay cover, and a recycling program was established to remove some items from the trash stream. Residential ash, incinerator ash, and the burn pit ash was collected in an 8yd metal container and hauled off periodically by Casella. Up until August 2008, the 119 New Boston Road site was the main area for recycling and trash collection for the Town of Candia. The facility and collections ceased August 31, 2008 when the Town moved to a new location and facility. The buildings remain on the New Boston Road site, but the site is no longer in use or disturbed.

### Facility Identification:

The site is located at 119 New Boston Rd, Map 406 Lot 101. Solid waste permit number is DES-SW-TP-96-001 and DES-SW-TP-96-002. The town's mailing address is 74 High Street Candia NH 03034.

Currently, the location is fenced on two sides of the eight acre parcel and the twenty foot front gate kept locked to prevent public access. Wetlands and the North Branch River outline the remaining two sides of the facility parcel. There are two buildings on site, the incinerator building and the swap shop/storage building. A 1000 gallon septic tank is buried in front of the office/incinerator building with a 27' X 15' leach field hugging the western fence. The 1000 gallon septic tank located in the ground in front of the office area will be decommissioned. There is a dug well located off the back end of the building towards the western side and another well located near the entrance about 50

yards from the front gate. Other structures include retaining walls along the rear of the incinerator building, three cement pads ( the incinerator building floor and the pad that extends out front and the base for the accessory building), and cement glass bunkers.

### **Closure Schedule:**

Fall 2011- Create RFP for bids to get the main building, which housed the incinerator, tested with a licensed Industrial Hygienist. The hygienist will perform several tests of ash and dust throughout the facility main building and inside the incinerator and stack. Asbestos will be tested inside the incinerator as well. All data will be placed into a packet. The testing profile packet will be included in the closure plan which is to be submitted to DES for approval. The packet from the Scott Lawson Group provided in the complete plan will describe in detail all testing done and the results of those tests.

Fall 2009 - spring 2011- clean-up of residual waste will be removed and taken to the present recycling center or be hauled off for disposal by the town's designated hauler for MWS and C&D trash. Two 55 gallon drums containing waste oil to be transported to the present recycling facility at 29 Deer Run Rd and disposed of properly by the waste oil hauler for the town. The 3,000 gallon water tank used for the burn pit to be removed from the site and brought to the new site for recycling.

### Summer 2011-winter 2011

The Board of Selectmen to approve the disassemble and removal of the accessory building, formerly known as the old swap shop, and it will be placed in the Holbrook cemetery for the future use by the Cemetery department under the supervision of the Superintendent of Cemeteries.

1000 gallon septic tank to be fully emptied by a licensed septic contractor and the tank will be filled with sand

The incinerator stack to be disassembled and taken down for recycling of the metal and the incinerator refractory will be taken apart and dismantled for disposal or recycling. The control panel will be recycled or disposed of properly and the remaining electrical components for the incinerator will be disposed of properly and safely. The main building will be disassembled and the metal recycled. Any C&D waste from the main building will be taken to the new facility and disposed of properly.

The parcel will be returned to as natural a condition as possible. Site work will be completed and the parcel will have sloping hills and a flat grade, and all areas of ash will be completely buried and undisturbed. Loaming and seeding of the site

will be included in the site work scope of work so that everything will be complete once the site work is finished.

**Waste Identification:**

The following materials were accepted at the New Boston Road site: MSW, glass ( clear, brown, and green), ceramics, pottery, mirrors, and windows; metals of all types ( ferrous and non-ferrous), tires, propane tanks no larger than 20lbs., household appliances such as refrigerators, stoves, washers/dryers and dishwashers; tin & aluminum ( cans and other items made from tin or aluminum) , cardboard, mixed paper, yard waste and other compostable material, brush, electronics, universal waste from households and small local businesses, waste oil & filters, rechargeable batteries, electronics of all types, and fluorescent light bulbs, construction & demolition material (roof shingles, treated wood, concrete, sheet rock, etc.), wire, and stove ash..

**Notifications:**

The Town notified its residents of the facility closure through signage at the 119 New Boston Rd facility and word of mouth from its employees and residents. A set date of August 31, 2008 was the final day of the facility use. Closure notification began, up to two months prior to the actual closure of the facility to ensure residents were well notified and all questions could be answered if available. Public meetings by the Solid Waste Committee were held for residents to see the plans and discuss the new site during development stages. Once the move was complete, the gates at 119 New Boston Rd were locked as were all buildings and a NO TRESSPASSING sign was posted on the gates.

**Closure Requirements**

Some residual recyclable material on the ground; such as an aluminum and fiberglass will be brought to the present center on Deer Run Rd and recycled properly, and any such scattered remains of trash or recyclables left on the topsoil of the facility grounds. Propane tanks have been removed. There is one steel water storage tank on the berm of the old open burn pit which is to be removed and brought to the Deer Run Rd facility and recycled with the metals. All remaining incinerator ash has been removed in sealed roll-of contained and sent to the ash landfill that we have used during the regular operation of the incinerator. Casella was the hauler for all ash removal at the New Boston Rd facility. All the compostable material and remaining burned brush and ash will be buried under dirt and loam once the site work begins.

The 119 New Boston Road site closure requirements are set forth by the Board of Selectmen in the Town of Candia as follows:

- 1) All remaining debris and site waste is to be removed as best as possible by contracted means or volunteers.
- 2) Both existing structures on the site are to be removed and recycled. The accessory building is to be transported to the Town of Candia's cemetery, Holbrook Cemetery, for use by the Town's Cemetery department under the supervision of the Superintendent of the Cemeteries.
- 3) The incinerator stack is to be disassembled and will be placed at the new facility for recycling of the metal.
- 4) The refractory will be properly disassembled and then disposed or recycled of properly in accordance with Solid Waste Regulations.
- 5) Proper testing to be conducted by a licensed Industrial Hygienist to determine levels of hazardous waste, if any, in the building, incinerator stack, and the refractory before any disassembly occurs. Report to accompany plan.
- 6) Loaming and seeding of the site per required regulations by DES will be performed and maintenance of the site will be conducted by the Town of Candia.

**Post- Closure Requirements:**

This section does not apply to the Town  
HOWEVER, while not related to the former facility, the Town remains obligated to keep a cover over the former ash landfill.

**Recordkeeping & Reporting Requirements:**

All town records of the former incinerator and recycling facility are kept at the Town Hall building.

**Other Permits**

Groundwater Management Permit, GWP-198400082-C-003, will not be closed out once the incinerator/landfill is closed. This permit is for the testing of the wells around and on the New Boston Road site and will be monitored for as long as required by DES.

Contact to the DES Air division was made and they informed the Town that all previous permits have expired as of 2008 and there is no need to close out any permits since they are no longer valid.

**Closure Cost Estimate:**

The following closure costs for the 119 New Boston Rd closure are listed below and copies of all work invoices the town obtained for the facility closure have been included to verify and document everything that was done to the site.





## November 2011

The Candia Recycling Center land-filled **67.52** tons of MSW during November 2011 with a year to date total of **677.79** tons land-filled. During November 2010 there was **77.19** tons of MSW land-filled with a year to date total of **660.33** tons land-filled. In November 2009 there was **52.25** tons of MSW land-filled with a year to date total of **635.78** tons land-filled.

The Candia Recycling Center land-filled **44.52** tons of C&D debris during November 2011 with a year to date total of **470.02** tons land-filled. During November 2010 there was **48.52** tons of C&D debris land-filled. While in November 2009 there was **55.99** tons of C&D debris land-filled with a year to date total of **544.24** tons land-filled.

During the month of November 2011 the Candia Recycling Center processed a grand total of **112.04** tons of waste with a year to date total of **1147.81** tons of waste land-filled. During the month of November 2010 the Candia Recycling Center processed a grand total of **125.71** tons of waste with a year to date total of **1106.84** tons land-filled. During the month of November 2009 the Candia Recycling Center processed a grand total of **108.24** tons of waste with a year to date total of **1179.96** tons land-filled.

The CRC created **33** bales of recyclable material which weighed **37,988** lbs. or **18.99** tons. There was one glass haul which weighed **18,240** lbs. or **9.12** tons and there was also one electronics haul which weighed **5690** lbs. or **2.85** tons.

The CRC recycled a grand total **61,920 lbs.** or **30.96** tons of material during the month of November 2011.

On 11/15 the scrap metal pile was removed, there was **33.18** tons of metal recycled which generated **\$6304.20** in revenue.

On 11/18 there was a mixed load of non-ferrous metals delivered, there was **7195** lbs. or **3.60** tons recycled which generated **\$3274.64** in revenue.

On 11/28 aluminum cans we shipped out earlier in a consolidation load was marketed and our **3767** lbs. of aluminum cans generated **\$2542.73** in revenue.

The CRC generated **\$12,121.57** in revenue during the month of November 2011.

## **2012 Proposed Budget – Amended**

At prior meetings, the Board made the following changes to the proposed 2012 budget:

- Remove the \$28,000 for the cruiser
- Added a total of \$408 to the Treasurer's budget as follows:
  1. Increased Deputy Treasurer wages by \$100 due to more trips to the bank.
  2. Increased Postage & Mileage line by \$300 due to more trips to the bank.
  3. Increased FICA & Medi taxes line by \$8 due to increase in Deputy wages.

The new bottom line total is **\$2,312,536**. This is a reduction from the 2011 budget of \$10,052, or a reduction of .43%.

If this is OK, we need to have a **formal motion to approve the amended budget**.
