The Candia Recycling Center land-filled **57.37** tons of MSW during March 2012. The CRC land-filled **56.48** tons of MSW during March 2011, while March of 2010 there was **52.40** tons of MSW land-filled. In March 2009 the CRC land-filled **58.64** tons of MSW.

The CRC disposed of **36.95** tons of C&D debris during March 2012, in March 2011 the CRC disposed of **43.78** tons of C&D debris. The CRC disposed of **59.88** tons of C&D debris during March 2010 and in 2009 there was **60.80** tons of C&D debris disposed.

The CRC processed **94.32** tons of waste during March 2012. In March 2011 the CRC processed **100.26** tons of waste, while in 2010 the CRC processed **122.28** tons of waste and in March 2009 the CRC processed **119.44** tons of waste.

Recyclables

Mix paper - 18 bales = 23,090 lbs. = 11.55 tons

Cardboard - 7 bales = 8000 lbs. = 4 tons

There were 34 bales created which equaled 38,208 lbs. or 19.10 tons.

1 glass haul = **18,220** lbs. or **9.11** tons

1 electronics haul = **6525** lbs. =**3.25** tons

Total recyclables for the month of March 2012 was **62,953** lbs. or **31.48** tons.

On 3/23 we sent out 17 bales of tin cans which weighed approximately **14,000** lbs of tin cans, **9** bales of Alum. cans which weighed approximately **5,000** lbs. and **4** bales of #2 natural plastic which weighed approximately **3,100** lbs. This material is stored until a full load is acquired and then it is marketed, full loads are paid the highest amounts. The value of this load is about **\$7,100**. Of course the actual amount is determined by what the market is paying at the time of marketing.

Subject: Parks, Other Culture & Recreation Monthly Report

Moore Park

The park is up and running for the spring season, with families and kids showing up on a daily basis. The Field Day in April prepared the ball fields and spruced up the park. The bathrooms are operational and the water is turned on. The playing field grassy areas are looking pretty sparse this year and possible turf improvements are being looked at. Only the front field is being used for softball again this year, so we may have the opportunity to work on the back part before soccer starts in the fall. Repairs to the playground equipment are on-going. A general review of the condition of the Doucette Fieldhouse is scheduled for this year, in conjunction with the CYAA.

Skateboard Park

The repairs to the additional donated equipment appear to be holding up well and the park is getting lots of use.

Summer Recreation Program(s)

I'm continuing to work with the public and providers to implement summer recreation program suggestions for the 2012 season. I've been approached by two different individuals interested in providing specific programs on our facilities, one for tennis and the other for child fitness activities.

Pond Park and Gazebo Area

There are a number of dead trees in the area that will have to be taken down this year as a part of the maintenance program. I'm working with the CCWC on an enhancement to the winter skating program.

Fitts Museum and Soldiers Monument

A review of the department electric bills hilited an issue where there are two separate meters feeding the Fitts Museum property. I'm working with the Museum Trustees to see how we can go to a single feed point, eliminating the duplicate monthly meter charge for the second meter.

Subject: Administration & Finance Monthly Report

Administration

Working with the staff, we are starting a review of the existing organizational structure and management processes to further improve the efficiency and effectivity of our operational and management teams. The organizational chart, job descriptions, policies and procedures will be compared with the actual performance requirements of the individual positions and equivalent positions in other comparable communities. Responsibilities within functional areas and their interactions with other functional areas will be reviewed and documented.

Organization and cataloging of existing town records and documentation is in-process and will be continued.

Finance

Working with the board, our department heads, our staff and the Municipal Budget Committee (MBC), we'll be developing the metrics, the management reports and the budgetary backup necessary to maintain and improve our existing services to the community while working to continue to stabilize the tax rate. Several new financial management reports are being made available to the board tonight and will be delivered to the MBC this week. More will be coming for the board's review in the near future. With the budget season only four (4) months away, we need to pursue a vigorous effort and a tight schedule to be prepared.

Infrastructure and Facilities

The new Town Office sign, donated thru the efforts of Mark Hebsch with his Eagle Scout project, is now installed and available for public viewing. We can expect a number of positive comments. We'll be publicizing the effort and it might be appropriate to schedule a dedication ceremony for our meeting the 21st.

The garden club continues their efforts to beautify our office grounds and many other locations around town. Their efforts are to be commended.

A review of the current state of the town facilities and the development of an overall preventive maintenance plan is in-process as the precursor for the capital improvement plan update.

The current discussions about map racks and the possibility of purchasing a property in the four corners center of town is directly related to the issues raised in past discussions about the Smyth Memorial Building and space needs in the current Town Office Building and other town facilities. A number of committees, commissions and officials are suffering from the lack of storage space as well as the lack of public access, a significant issue with costly implications. It is my opinion that we need to address these issues sooner rather than later.

To Whom It May Concern,

Please be advised that Brenda Wilbert has been receiving medical care in my office for many years. She has significant health problems that will be exacerbated by exposure to new asphalt fumes. To prevent worsening of her medical condition, she would need to leave her residence for at least 1-2 weeks during repaving. After the road is paved, her reaction to exposure will diminish over time as the fumes "off-gas". The "off-gassing" process can be accelerated by covering the new surface with a fine layer of sand or stone dust. The removal of the old road will produce dust, but this will be much less problematic for her.

As an alternative, if the road is repaved with concrete, there will be much less risk imposed on Ms. Wilbert's health and well-being..
