In the process of obtaining a contract for auctioneering services with Paul McInnis, Inc. to present to our board at our next meeting, I was disappointed to learn the terms originally proposed by that firm were rescinded in light of the elimination of 308 Raymond Rd.(the highest value property) from the list of properties to be sold.

Mr. McInnis has since proposed terms substantially at variance with the conditions for which our board has expressed its preference. He proposed an on-line auction with no minimum bid as well as a \$1500 allowance for advertising expenses.

In light of this dramatic departure from our stated preference I met with Jim St. Jean and his brother, Jay on June 30<sup>th</sup> at the Town offices. Mr. St. Jean has vast experience selling tax deeded properties and he agreed that our preference for a live auction with reasonable minimum bids is both customary and effective. Moreover, he charges no advertising allowance and the purchaser pays his fee.

Accordingly, I have invited Mr. St. Jean to address our board when it next meets on July 13<sup>th</sup>. He will answer any questions and address any concerns we may have regarding this process. Mr. St. Jean will have a contract for our consideration and if approved, the auction will be held on Saturday, October 24, 2015. This will allow the required 90 day notice to the former owners required under RSA 80:89.
