There was general agreement expressed by members of the Commission and the discussion subsequently was limited to that approach.

Changes to the design and specifications were highlighted by Mr. Monahon After a general discussion the commission agreed to request time at the March 26th meeting of the Board of Selectmen (BOS) for a presentation regarding the Smyth Memorial Building and to seek a determination by the BOS to publish an Invitation to Bid to approved contractors.
