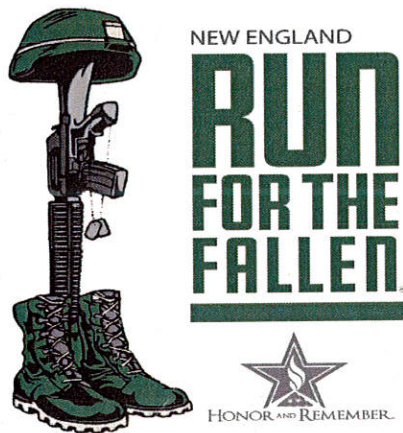

NEW ENGLAND RUN FOR THE FALLEN

Dear Sponsor,

Massachusetts Honor and Remember Chapter has organized the New England Run For the Fallen, a special event to call attention to and honor the men and women who have recently died in military service to America. A team of more than 20 members from the public throughout New England will embark on a 143 plus mile journey to honor every New England service member who dies as a result of serving during the War on Terror and in support of Operation Iraq Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom, and Operation New Dawn.

Each mile of the Route will be dedicated to an individual/ or individuals New England hero and his or her family. The run team will stop at each Hero Marker (mile marker) to give tribute to waiting Gold Star Family members, friends and comrades. The goal of the event is to create a 531- mile memorial tribute throughout New England from Bernardston Massachusetts to McClary Park, Kittery Point Kittery Maine. Each hero marker tribute will include a biographical description of the hero along with an American and Honor and Remember flags. A Gold Star family is one who has lost an "immediate" family member in support of our Nation's freedoms.

New England Run For the Fallen will begin Friday August 20, 2021 at Cushman Park in Bernardston Massachusetts at 7:00 am with an opening ceremony. We will run through Mass, VT, NH, and Me covering over 140 miles honoring over 531 fallen heroes. We will arrive at McClary Park Kittery Maine at 12:40 pm on August 22, 2021.

RE: American Rescue Plan Act

The application for the funds allocated to the Town of Candia by the American Rescue Plan Act has been accepted (subject to one administrative detail which is being resolved). We can expect to receive one half of \$391,944.33 within 30 days of the date the application is accepted as complete with the balance in 6 months.

Because the Treasury regulations that prescribe acceptable uses for these funds are complex and the town is accountable for their use, I recommend a committee be formed to solicit proposed uses of these funds from town department heads and make recommendations to the board of selectmen as to the allocation of the proceeds. The allowable use of these funds is summarized as follows:

- Support public health expenditures, by, for example, funding COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff
- Address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency, including economic harms to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector
- Replace lost public sector revenue, using this funding to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic
- Provide premium pay for essential workers, offering additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors
- Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet

Of particular interest to the committee investigating the construction of a new police facility is the following provision in the regulations:

Other response and adaptation costs include capital investments in public facilities to meet pandemic operational needs, such as physical plant improvements to public hospitals and health clinics or adaptations to public buildings to implement COVID-19 mitigation tactics.

I recommend that our board appoint a three member committee comprised of representatives from the Budget Committee, the Planning Board, and the Board of Selectmen. Bob Stout and Mark Chalbeck would be excellent choices as they both serve in two capacities: Budget Committee and Planning Board, respectively. Please schedule a discussion of this matter at our next board meeting.

Eligible Uses of SLFRF monies

The eligible uses are explained in Treasury's Interim Final Rule (IFR).

In brief, the basic purposes for which the funds can be used are as follows:

1. Public Health
2. Negative Economic Impacts
3. Services to Disproportionality Impacted Communities
4. Premium Pay*
5. Infrastructure (Water, Sewer, Broadband)
6. Revenue replacement^
7. Administrative expenses (relative to administering/spending/reporting on use of LFRF money)

a) To respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;

(b) To respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers;

(c) For the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency; and

(d) To make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

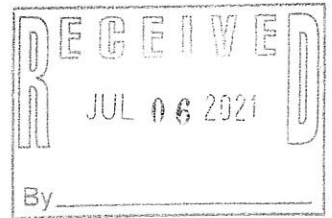

In recent months, State, local, and Tribal governments across the country have mobilized to support the national vaccination campaign, resulting in over 250 million doses administered to date.^[25]
