Dear Board of Selectman and Town Administrator Spencer,

Thank you for the opportunity to speak with you tonight. I'd like to take a few moments to highlight the importance of police details and the value they bring to both public safety and municipal operations.

Police details play a critical role in our community. Whether it's traffic control at a busy construction site, crowd management at a local event, or ensuring safety during utility work, these details help protect residents, workers, and motorists. Most importantly, they do so without impacting the town's budget—because the cost is covered by the private entity requesting the detail.

The Police Detail Fund ensures this program runs smoothly. It collects payments, compensates officers, and uses a small administrative fee to cover coordination, recordkeeping, and compliance. The funds can be used to support public safety equipment—again, at no cost to the taxpayer.

By supporting and strengthening this current program, we allow:

- Our on-duty officers to stay focused on emergency response and patrols;
- Businesses and contractors to operate safely and efficiently;
- And the town to maintain a self-sustaining public safety service.

I ask that the Board continue to recognize the importance of this program—not only as a financial asset, but as a safety solution that reflects our commitment to responsible and effective community management. I have enclosed the detail rate of the neighboring towns.

The Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 added Section 287(g) to the Immigration and Nationality Act. ERO's 287(g) program works in collaboration with Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) through voluntary partnerships with state and local law enforcement agencies, authorizing designated officers to perform limited immigration law enforcement functions under ICE supervision.



Models of 287(g) Program

Jail Enforcement Model

JEM



The JEM Model delegates certain authority to state and local law enforcement agencies to identify criminal aliens and immigration violators in state or local custody and place them into immigration proceedings.

Warrant Service Officer

WSO



The WSO Model provides legal authority to state and local law enforcement officers to execute civil immigration warrants on behalf of ERO within the confines of their detention facilities.

Task Force Model

TFM



The TFM Model serves as a force multiplier for state and local law enforcement agencies to enforce limited immigration authority with ICE oversight during their routine police duties.

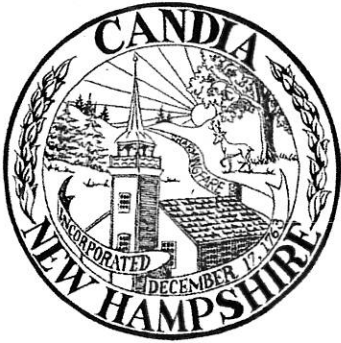

Hello all,

From January 1st through March 31st of 2024 the Building Department conducted 106 Inspections. From January 1st to March 31st of 2025 we conducted 84 inspections.

Please see the attached permit data from these same dates.

This past month we have made some headway with the permits that have been left open, and it appears that many of them were in house clerical errors. I have closed roughly 20 left open permits.

I have been in communication with the Towns Attorney for 308 Raymond and it appears we will be in court sometime in May for the violations on site.

I have filled out the Health Officer paperwork that the Board needs to sign.

I have been working on establishing a Mutual Aid agreement between Candia and Raymond and would like the Boards opinion on whether to move forward with this. I have attached a copy of what I have so far to this report.


